- Hard Mouth: Teaching bite inhibition, managing hard mouth behavior

- Leash Pulling/Leash Grabbing: Variable click & treat to focus on handler not environment; short intense play time to defuse excess energy.

More Problem Behaviors (PBOTA) & Solutions

- Housetraining: Dealing with not-normal house soiling behaviors
- **Predatory Behavior**: counter conditioning to modify "fun-chase" association; teach operant response to interrupt chase, use of Premack
- Crating Woes: Modifying fear of crates, inappropriate use of crates, crate-soiling
- Canine Obsessive Compulsive Disorders (OCD's): Causes and types of OCD's; Modification programs; Pharmaceutical intervention.
- Fears, Anxieties, Phobias: Diagnoses, prevention, desensitization & counter conditioning, operant conditioning

Role of Stress in Aggressive Behaviors; Strategies for Stressors:

- Eliminate
- Medical Evaluation
- Prevent exposure
- Counter conditioning/operant conditioning

Classifications of Aggression Behaviors & Modification / Management Options:

- **Fear Based**: scrupulous management of environment for dog's security during modification / perhaps always.
- **Idiopathic**: ("rage"--unknown origin): rare and rarely treatable.
- **Interdog**: Based on social hierarchies; teaching operant response to cues for deference; classical conditioning re: good things happen with other dogs.

Classifications of Aggression & Modification / Management Options (continued)

- Maternal: Pups can learn by observing mother's aggressions.
- **Play**: From rough-housing with dogs or humans; close supervision; when to interrupt escalation; matching of play styles.
- **Possession**: Manage environment; remove all triggers; 10 point multi-week exercises for food and all desirables-the "Trade Game"
- **Predatory**: (see Day 1: 1 to 2:30pm session).
